RE: Pathogen Inactivated Blood Component Introduction and Upcoming Information Sessions

Transfusion Medicine (TM) Laboratories throughout Saskatchewan receive blood components and blood products from Canadian Blood Services (CBS). As a result of active initiatives to enhance patient safety, CBS is introducing pathogen inactivated technology (PIT) psoralen-treated pooled platelets as a part of their standard blood inventory. Restrictions on the availability of Solvent Detergent (S/D) plasma have also been lifted.

Pathogen Inactivated Technology (PIT) Psoralen-Treated Pooled Platelets

Implementation of these PIT platelets in Saskatchewan is currently targeted for July 10, 2023. For the first 3 months following introduction, distribution of the PIT platelets will be limited to Saskatoon and Regina, and dependent on CBS inventory availability (specific requests for PIT platelets cannot be made). Processes for platelet orders from CBS remain unchanged. Rural sites will begin receiving PIT platelets once lab information system code builds are completed.

In preparation for the PIT psoralen-treated pooled platelet roll-out, a series of online information sessions have been scheduled which are open to <u>all</u> healthcare providers and lab technologists. At these meetings, CBS Medical Officers will be present to answer questions about PIT platelets, discuss available educational resources and review hospital considerations. You are invited to attend any <u>one</u> of the following four sessions (approx. 30 minutes each):

Solvent Detergent (S/D) Plasma

A provincial strategy for transition of frozen plasma stock to S/D plasma is currently in development. A staged transition is planned throughout the summer months, with transition planned to occur first in Saskatoon and Regina hospitals. Communications with laboratory services and clinical care departments are forthcoming.
